**Mallard Barn Driven Game Shooting** - Box Tree Farm in Wattisham, Suffolk has been in the Rushbrook family for three generations. During that time it has developed an enviable reputation for driven game shooting, on its 4,000 acre estate, attracting guns from the UK, Europe and America. Box Tree Farm is ideally situated on the outskirts of Wattisham village which boasts its own moated manor house in its centre. The village is a quiet, picturesque rural retreat for those wishing to get away from it all.

It offers top quality partridge shooting in September and October and then moves on to mixed pheasant and partridge days from November to January. The topography of the land is undulating and there are 35 drives to choose from. The shooting area is 4,500 acres and Scott Baker is the game keeper. The shoot has been built up over the last 40 years with many long established shooting guests returning year after year. There are many tall hedges and small valleys which show great birds.
